Worship is...

One beautiful image of worship comes from the 19th century Danish philosopher and theologian Soren (Sorin) Kierkegaard. Kierkegaard describes worship a drama or theatre. The worship leaders (Mary Jo, the choir and the liturgist when we have one, and Andrew) are the conductors, the congregation (those sitting in the pews or in your lawn chairs, or in the comfort of your home) are the actors, and God...God is the audience. God is the recipient of our worship. Worship is not about us. It is all meant to be for and about God. So, at the end of worship please refrain from clapping. The hope and prayer are that God is giving us all a standing ovation or a round of applause for how we have worshiped God today. Instead of clapping at the end of worship consider sharing a phrase of praise such as an “Amen”, “Thanks be to God”, or “Alleluia”.
